ABOUT SKAGIT LAND TRUST

Skagit Land Trust was founded in 1992 to conserve wildlife habitat, agricultural and forest lands, scenic open space, wetlands, and shorelines for the benefit of our community and as a legacy for future generations of people and wildlife. We have four main programs:

In **Land Conservation**, the Trust prioritizes protecting lands and natural processes needed for resilient ecosystems for people, plants and wildlife. We also preserve places that enhance people's quality of life such as nature parks, wildlife viewing areas and trail corridors. We purchase lands as conservation areas, work with willing landowners to protect special lands they own, and assist other conservation successes through extensive partnerships.

Our **Stewardship Program** cares for our 43 conservation areas and 36 conservation easements with the help of 400 volunteers of all ages. Volunteers do everything from adopting a property, assisting with wildlife habitat improvements, trail-building, monitoring land, helping by mapping, and taking pictures and videos.

Education and Outreach oversees member events and community outreach that brings people in contact with the land and people who want to protect it. We have strong citizen science endeavors and regularly host college interns. Our youth program and network of conservation classrooms helps school-aged young people experience and study nature close to where they live.

Our **Public Policy Program** works to build a bipartisan consensus and an engaged community that advances beneficial plans, policies and practices that affect land conservation and wildlife. Visit our "Take Action" page on our website to learn more.

The places we protect with you are sanctuaries for birds, fish and other wildlife. Other protected lands are vital as peaceful refuges for our community to visit, as working farms and ranches, as sources of clean water, and as needed forest preserves.

Today, the amount of land and habitat protected and managed by the Trust has grown to more than 8,366 acres, including 44 miles of shoreline.

Skagit Land Trust became one of the first land trusts in the nation to receive accreditation from the national Land Trust Accreditation Commission. Accreditation is a mark of distinction, showing Skagit Land Trust meets high standards for land conservation.


