

# Blanchard Strategy Group Recommended Core

It is the intent of the Strategies Group to create a core zone that does not exceed 1,600 acres.

DNR will work in collaboration with the Blanchard Forest Advisory Committee to review timber management strategies in three areas: labeled "CC" and "JJ" along the western edge of the core, and in "B" on the southern slope.
